A NEW KIND OF LEARNING

Courses at PSIA are different from other universities'.

What we DON'T do: make you memorize facts to repeat back to us.

What we DO do: encourage you to <u>think critically about political issues</u>: What are a political event's causes? What are its effects? What is the evidence or arguments for accepting a policy, concept, or theory? Do the evidence and arguments rest on false assumptions? Do they really prove what they claim?

Thinking critically about politics is a skill which you will have the rest of your life.

- > A minimum 25th percentile score on the GRE quantitative examination
- > A high undergraduate Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Two letters of recommendation
- A concise and informative personal statement



Graduation Requirements

To graduate with a Master of PSIA students must complete

- > 54 credit hours of coursework
- Capstone Master's Essay
- Policy Internship Project or Policy Paper
- At least one credit in environmental studies in satisfaction of the university-wide environmental studies requirement
- Cumulative grade-point (GPA) average of 3.0 or higher
